Clerk-Recorder Set to Close Out the Year With Special Saturday Hours!

Beat the holiday rush and get the marriage and passport services you need! Plan now to take advantage of Clerk-Recorder Hugh Nguyen's special Saturday hours set for Saturday, December 17, 2022, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Old County Courthouse in Santa Ana and at the department's branch offices in Anaheim and Laguna Hills. The department will be offering marriage services at all three locations. Passport services will also be available at the Old County Courthouse in Santa Ana and at the department's North County branch office in Anaheim. Please note, no passport services will be offered at the department's South County branch office in Laguna Hills. Appointments are highly recommended due to the demand for marriage and passport services during these special hours. Walk-ins are welcomed. For more information and to complete an online application for a marriage license, ceremony, or passport in advance, please visit us at <u>OCRecorder.com</u>.

"We always experience an increase for marriage services at the end of the year and I am sure this year will not be the exception," said Clerk-Recorder Hugh Nguyen. "I am glad that I can make it convenient for busy families and individuals to come to our offices to get the services they need during the busy holiday season."

Another reason to join us during these special hours, the department has one of the lowest costs for a marriage license and a marriage ceremony in the state. In Orange County, couples can obtain a public marriage license for \$61 and a confidential marriage license for \$66. A civil marriage ceremony can be performed for an additional \$28. The department processes new passport applications only. Passport photos are available for \$7 - which may be the lowest passport photo fee in the county.

Again, appointments are highly recommended due to the popularity of these special Saturday hours; however, walk-ins will be served on a first-come-first-served basis. No additional Clerk-Recorder services will be available during this special opening. To save time, marriage license, ceremony, and passport applications can be completed online in advance at <u>OCRecorder.com</u>. As an added convenience, passport photos are available on the spot for \$7. Free parking will be available at all three locations.

NOVEMBER IN O.C. HISTORY

Nov. 2, 1967	Yorba Linda became an incorporated city with a population of about 11,433.
Nov. 4, 1841	The Bidwell-Bartleson Party arrived in California from Missouri, becoming the first of many emigrant wagon trains to arrive in California from the Midwest.
Nov. 4, 1948	The week-long Green River Fire began near what is now Featherly Regional Park in Anaheim. The wildfire eventually burned more than 53,000 acres and destroyed 22 homes.
Nov. 6, 1905	The Pacific Electric Railway officially opened its line from Watts to Santa Ana (with connecting lines making much of Los Angeles easily accessible). The first "Red Car" trolley in Santa Ana– a parlor car called "El Peregrino" – had arrived the day before. On November 22, Santa Ana celebrated the arrival of the trolleys with a "Parade of Products" through downtown with fireworks and a large banquet.
Nov. 29, 1831	Pio Pico, Juan Bandini and Jose Antonio Carrillo lead a revolt against California Governor Manuel Victoria, who quickly resigned.
